This notice updates the previous General Procurement Notices for this project, which were published on NEFCO’s website, section Procurement Notices (<https://www.nefco.org/procurements/>) on March 01, 2017 and on March 01, 2020.

The Executive committee of Chernivtsi City Council will keep on announcing the competitive tendering for the works, goods and services defined by the Project “Energy efficiency improvements in public buildings in the city of Chernivtsi”.

The Executive committee of Chernivtsi City Council duly represented by the department of Urban Planning and Land Relations of Chernivtsi City Council intends using proceeds of a loan from the Nordic Environment Finance Corporation (NEFCO), equity of the city of Chernivtsi and grants funds from Eastern Europe Energy Efficiency and Environment Partnership (E5P) Fund* for the works, goods and services as listed below.

The Project is being implemented in accordance with the decision №198 of the Chernivtsi City Council dated 17 May 2016 “On attracting the loan facility from NEFCO for financing the Project “Energy efficiency improvements in public buildings in the city of Chernivtsi””. The Project, which has a total estimated budget in 2021 of up to 36,65 million UAH (1,07 million Euro) would require the procurement of contracts for implementation of the following energy efficiency measures over the next twelve months:

- thermal modernization of the public buildings;
- partial replacement of the windows and entrance doors;
- partial replacement of the cooking stoves;
- partial replacement of the incandescent light bulbs for the LED bulbs;
- reconstruction of the heating systems;
- balancing of the heating system;
- installation of individual heating substations with climate and daily temperature conditions control;

- installation of the local ventilation systems with heat regeneration.

Technical assistance for the project implementation is enabled by the financial support from Sweden.

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*The Eastern Europe Energy Efficiency and Environment Partnership (E5P) Fund is a €180 million multi-donor fund managed by the EBRD and designed to promote energy efficiency investments in Ukraine and other eastern European countries. The fund was established under an initiative of the Swedish government during its presidency of the European Union (EU) in 2009. E5P complements energy efficiency loans provided by financial institutions including the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, the European Investment Bank, KfW, NEFCO and the World Bank Group.
