Energy and climate policy targets for Sweden



50 per cent more efficient use of energy in 2030, compared with 2005



70 per cent less emissions from transports 2030 compared with 2010



100 per cent renewable electricity to 2040



No net emissions of greenhouse gases by 2045

Objectives for the Article 6 cooperation

- Contribute to the fulfillment of Sweden's climate goal by 2030 and 2045.
- Raise ambition globally.
- Support low and middle income countries in over-achieving their climate plans.

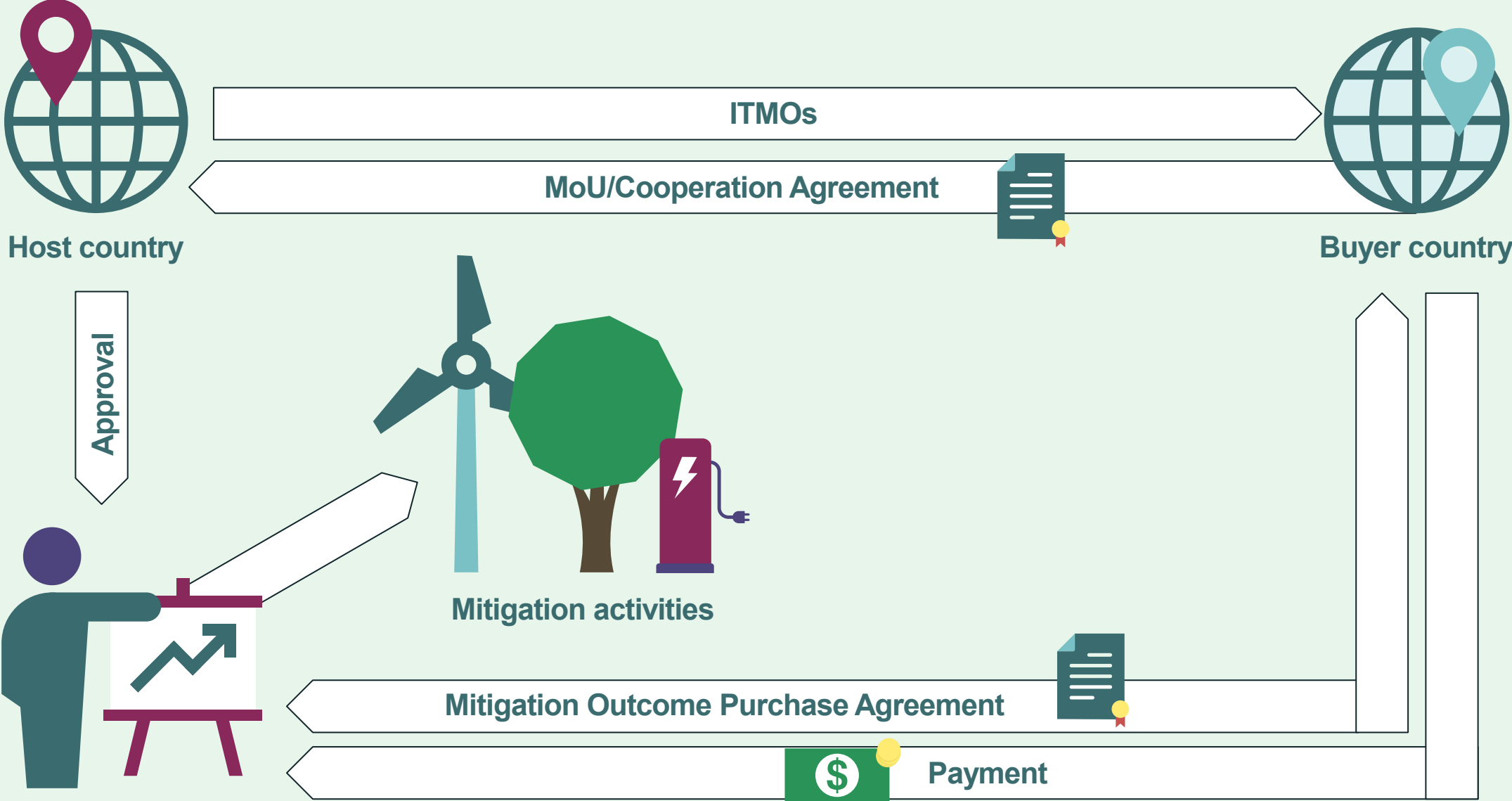


Ghana and Sweden signs MoU Dec 2021

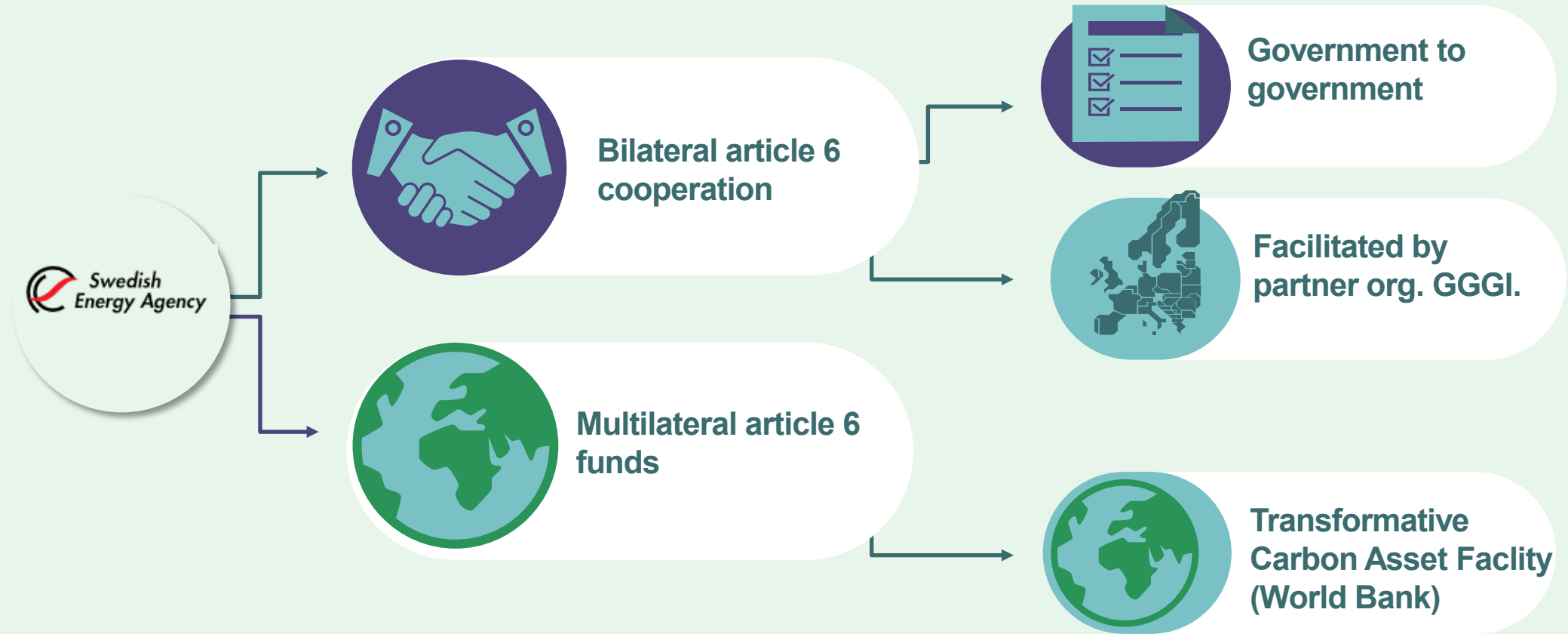


Nepal and Sweden signs MoU June 2021

Transaction model used by Sweden

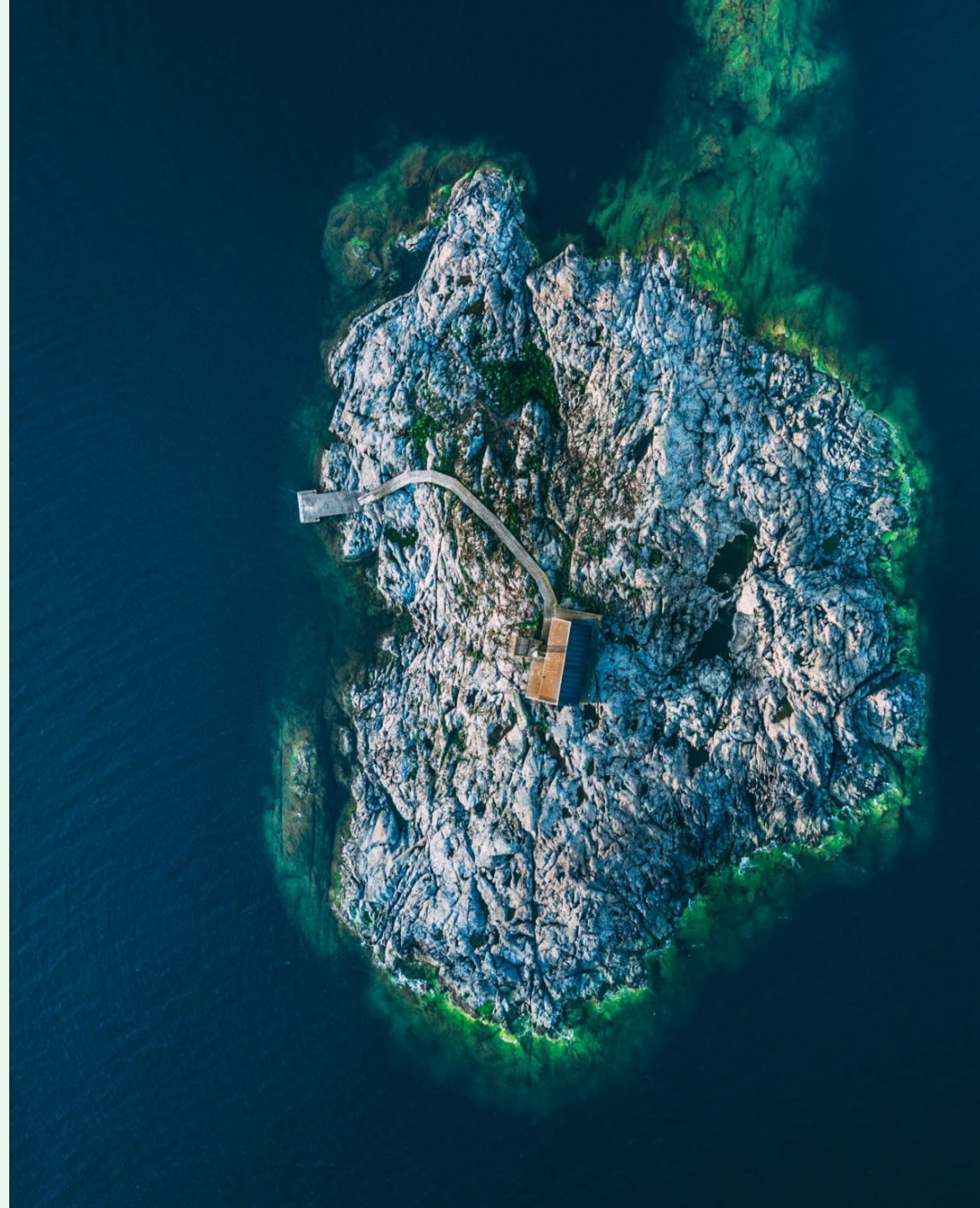


Development of Article 6-cooperation

- Host-country dialogue is key





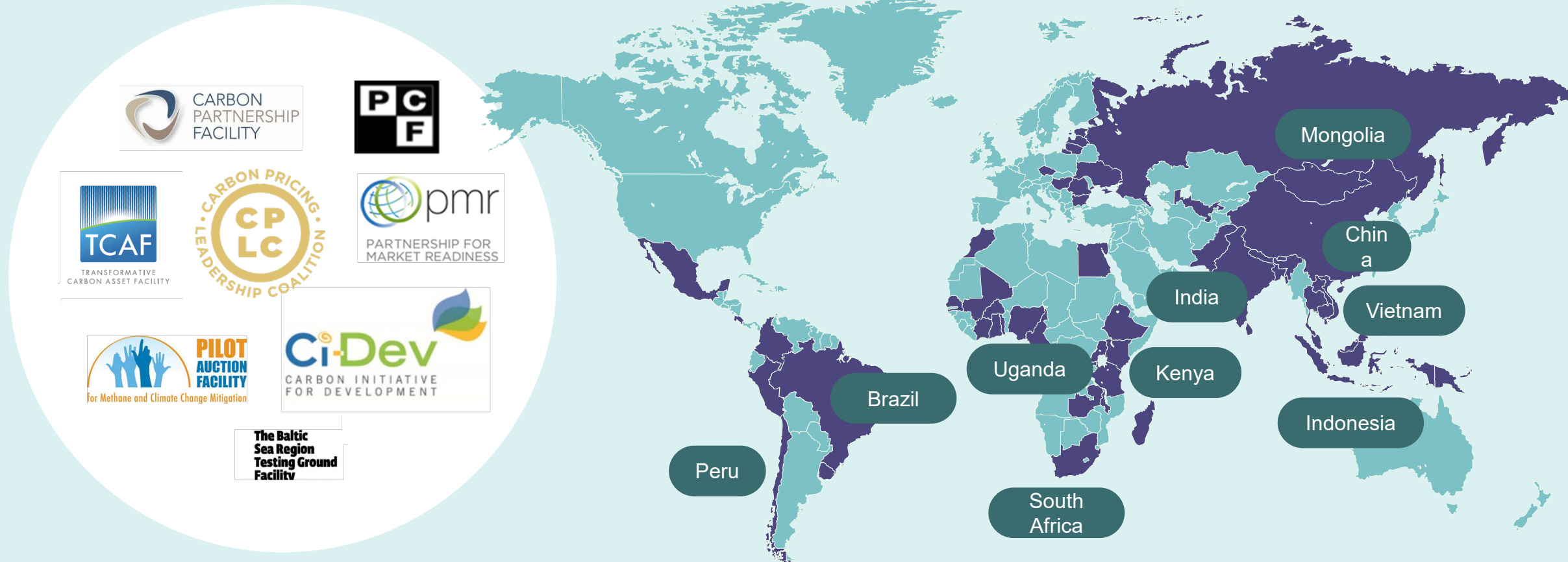

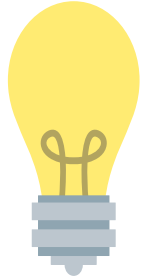
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Sweden's engagement in the CDM and JI under the Kyoto Protocol – 2.5 billion SEK

Sweden's article 6 work plan



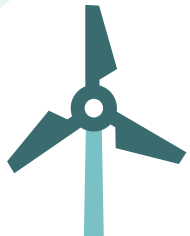
